



## Jooust Contributes Towards The Covid-19 Pandemic By Donating Disinfecting Agents To The County Government Of Siaya

Jaramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and Technology donated a consignment of disinfecting agents to the County Government of Siaya as part of its' contribution towards the COVID-19 pandemic. The handing over ceremony which took place at the Siaya County Referral Hospital was witnessed by the Chief Administrative Secretary in the State Department for University Education and Research, Ministry of Education Ms. Mumina Bonaya.
