
Keep in touch with changes in learning trends and forecast on possible future growth. The state of our workforce depends on how higher learning adapts to the changing needs of the workplace.

The School of Agricultural and Food Sciences (SAFS) is a comprehensive establishment of Jaramogi Oginga Odinga University of Science and Technology for higher education, research and outreach in agriculture, food and resource economics that targets rural communities in the region. The School has relocated to a new campus in Siava town, 14 miles south of Bondo town where the main campus of JOOUST is located. The new campus has

a vast land, and thus offers immense opportunities for training and research. In addition, the School has brought over 700 students and faculty to Siaya town, creating lasting benefits for the local community in form of increased economic opportunities, proximity of advanced instruction and research initiatives in a

griculture, and increased community outreach services.

The School is multi-disciplinary in nature, offering programmes ranging from soil science, animal science, horticulture, agribusiness, agricultural education and extension and food sciences. The programmes are designed to provide all-round training, including practical orientation, seminars, lectures and field/industrial attachments for skills development and enhancement. Currently there are two departments: Department

of Agricultural Economics and Agribusiness management which offers Doctor of Philosophy in Agricultural Extension, Master of Science in Agricultural Extension, Doctor of Philosophy in Agribusiness Management. Master of Science in Agribusiness Management, Bachelor of Science in Agricultural Extension Education and Bachelor of Science in Agribusiness Management. Department of Plant, Animal and Food Sciences which offers Doctor of Philosophy in Food Security and Sustainable Agriculture, Master of Science in Food Security and Sustainable Agriculture, Bachelor of Science in Soil Science, Bachelor of Science in Animal Science. Bachelor of Science in Horticulture and Bachelor of Science in Food Security. In addition, the School is also home to the Africa Center of Excellence in SustainableUse of Insects as Food

and Feeds (INSEFOODS). INSEFOODS, which is under the Department of Plant, Animal, and Food Sciences. It is one of the 24 competitively selected centers at universities under the World Bank's Eastern and Southern Africa Higher Education Centers of Excellence Project II (ACE II). The goal of the Center is to achieve long-term food and nutritional security by using insects as a cost-effective, reliable and sustainable source of protein and other nutrients for food and feeds. The School has plans to establish a programme in Veterinary Sciences.

The School of Informatics houses two departments – the Department of Computer Science and Software Engineering headed by Dr. Joshua Agola and the Department of Information Systems and Technology headed by Dr. Samuel Livala. The school is determined to harness the power of ICT to drive the "big 4 agenda" through innovative research and teaching methods. The school is committed to deliver the highest levels of excellence in teaching, research, and outreach activities as per the JOOUST mandate. We have some of the best faculty in the computing field with several years of experience. Many of our faculty have published in peer reviewed journals and are actively involved in grant proposal writing. We have experienced growth in the number of students which is currently 770 compared to 420 about four years ago. In the area of capacity building, we have graduated 4 PhDs members of staff during the last 3 years and others are in line to graduate as well.

Our programmes have grown as well. Our newly developed multidisciplinary programme (Masters/PhD) in Innovation and Sustainable Development has attracted fully sponsored students. Currently, we are working towards developing an industry driven Master's programme in Artificial Intelligence and Data Analytics. Our students have equally excelled in developing innovations in line with the national research priorities. KLIND AIR, an innovative student project, in the school, won the Nairobi HULTZ PRIZE Regionals and has been invited to participate in the Accelerator Programme in the United Kingdom. The team has also appeared in several local TV stations to showcase their product/innovation.

The School of Spatial Planning and Natural Resource Management strives to promote integration of natural, built, social and economic environments to achieve sustainability in societal development. It endeavors to inculcate bottom up problem solving approach that critically assess planning, design, management and conservation challenges, opportunities and aspirations to formulate transformative strategies towards sustainable use of natural resources as well as sustainable cities and communities.

The School runs two departments, namely: the Department of Spatial Planning; and the Department of Natural Resources Management. It is within the two departments that a number of demand-driven

postgraduate, undergraduate and diploma programmes are offered. These include PhD in Planning; MA in Project Planning & Management; MSc in Urban Environmental Planning & Management; Bachelor of Arts in Spatial Planning & Design; BSc in Water Resource & Environmental Management; and Diploma in Disaster Management. The school also hosts Pii Global Institute which focuses on the promotion of access to portable water.

The School has been collaboratively involved in a number of research grant projects, which are pertinent to the discovery and advancement of knowledge and skills around her programmes and specialties.

These include: Sustainable Urban Futures under Kisumu Local Interactive Platform (KLIP) funded by Mistra Urban Futures and SIDA; World Bank sponsored INSEFOODS; Urban Poverty/Food Security funded by ESRC/DFID; ArcGIS Enterprise Educational Support funded by ESRI; Capacity building in Geospatial Technology funded by Servir Eastern and Southern Africa, NASA and USAID. The School, through the University, has established beneficial partnerships and linkages with both local and international institutions that include University of Oklahoma, USA; ESRI Eastern Africa/ESRI Inc, USA; RCMRD, Nairobi; Chalmers University, Sweden; and various national and county governments. With the challenged posed by Covid19, the school plans to undertake curricula,



pedagogic, technological and skills improvements to align its mandates with blended learning and market needs. In addition, we intend to sustain partnerships, linkages and outreach endeavors in order to improve our impact on the society. Team KLIND AIR will be representing JOOUST, Kenya and Africa at large in the accelerator programme at Boston, USA, if selected to proceed to the next stage. After 5-8 weeks of incubation in Boston, the top 6 teams will pitch for USD 1 Million in startup funding at the United Nations Headquarters in New York.

Hult Prize is a global movement that crowd-sources ideas from University and College students by challenging them to solve a pressing social issue around topics such as: Food Security, Technology, Water Access, Energy, and Education. It is funded by the Hult family in partnership with the United Nations, Former US President Bill Clinton, Unicorn and other stakeholders. Each year, Bill Clinton is tasked with the responsibility of posing a new challenge for students to tackle innovatively.



The On Campus is a university-level programme that provides a chance for students with innovative ideas to actualize them into start-up enterprises.
